<u>Now</u>	Student, obtain a PIN by logging onto www.pin.ed.gov . Provide an e-mail that you check frequently or ask that the PIN be mailed to your current address. Keep your PIN where you can find it. (Start a financial aid folder.)	_____
<u>Now</u>	Parent, obtain a PIN by logging onto www.pin.ed.gov . Provide an e-mail that you check frequently or ask that the PIN be mailed to your current address. Keep your PIN where you can find it. (Start a financial aid folder.)	_____
<u>Now</u>	Log onto www.fafsa.ed.gov to file your 2009-2010 FAFSA. You will use your 2008 federal tax return. If that is not completed now, you can use your 2007 return and then update your FAFSA when your 2008 return is complete.	_____
<u>By Mar. 1, 2009</u>	Indiana residents, file the 2009-2010 FAFSA or renew your FAFSA to be eligible for State of Indiana grants and benefits. March 10 each year is the absolute deadline.	_____
_____	Two or three weeks after you file: Check your Student Aid Report (FAFSA results) on the FAFSA Web site and check the comments at the end that list any issues you need to take care of. Or you can call the FAFSA Central Processing Service (800-433-3243) and ask if your EFC (expected family contribution) has been calculated. If not, ask what corrections you need to make.	_____
_____	Open all mail from the financial aid office. Return promptly any documents that are requested. Follow directions carefully when returning documents. For example, if submitting a copy of a federal tax return, sign it either on front or on signature line.	_____
<u>By May 1, 2009</u>	Check the State Student Assistance Commission of Indiana (SSACI) Web site (www.ssaci.in.gov/estudent) to see if you have any FAFSA corrections (called “edits” by SSACI) that you need to make. These must be made no later than May 15, 2009.	_____
<u>By Aug. 1</u>	SSACI sends awards only to the Indiana school listed first on the FAFSA. If you are coming to Vincennes University but did not list VU first, you can change that on the SSACI Web site.	_____

Vincennes University’s college code is **001843**. All campuses of VU—Vincennes, Jasper, Aviation Technology Center, and American Sign Language Program—use this number.

How to avoid some common errors that hold up processing your FAFSA

1. Read and follow directions carefully.
2. Make sure your name and Social Security number match those on your Social Security card, and make sure your birth date is correct. Be careful to have last and first names in correct order as asked for on the FAFSA.
3. Do not leave the answer to question 23 about drug conviction issues blank.
4. As you enter financial figures, follow directions about which lines to use from the version of the tax return that you filed (1040, 1040A, or 1040 EZ).
5. If you will not have your taxes filed by March 10, fill out the FAFSA anyway. Check the appropriate box in questions 33 and 82, then use figures from your prior year's taxes for questions 36-47 and 86-95. As soon as you file your taxes, submit corrections to FAFSA for these questions. To beat the state deadline for filing corrections, do this by May 15.
6. Note that question 36 asks for your (the student's) adjusted gross income, and question 37 asks how much tax you paid. Do NOT put the same figure for both these questions. You did not pay all your income (Q 36) in taxes (Q 37).
7. If you need to provide information about and from your parent(s), make sure parental name, Social Security number, and birth date are correct.
8. Note that question 86 asks for parental adjusted gross income, and question 87 asks how much parental tax was paid. Do NOT put the same figure for both these questions. Parents do not pay all their income (Q 86) in taxes (Q 87).
9. If you are a student who does not have to submit parental information, don't forget to do Step Five and answer questions 96-103.
10. Make sure Vincennes University (college code 001843) is on your list of colleges. If you are most interested in VU, list us first.
11. It is a good idea to click "Run Final Check" as you finish entering data. This can help you avoid some errors.
12. Be sure to follow directions all the way to the end. Take your time. Ideally, you are signing your online FAFSA with your PIN.
If you have to submit parental information, your parent **must** sign the FAFSA in one of two ways:
 - **either** your parent must also e-sign using his/her own PIN,
 - **or** you must print out a signature page that a parent must sign and **mail to the FAFSA processing center**. (The address is on the signature page.)Be sure to follow the directions to the end in order to **submit** your FAFSA. **The processing center will not process your FAFSA until they have the required signature(s).**
13. If you later submit corrections, be sure you follow screens out to the end to e-sign and then submit the corrections. Both student and parent must sign most corrections.
