Summer 2009 Registration Information

ADVISING/REGISTRATION: Students attending VU Jasper during Spring 2009 must have their schedules approved by their advisor. Your advisor will help you select your classes. Your advisor will complete your registration and provide you with a copy of your class schedule. You cannot register by phone.

ALL FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS TO THE UNIVERSITY, INCLUDING THOSE FOR SPRING 2009, MUST BE MET BEFORE REGISTRATION CAN BE COMPLETED.

Registration for current (Spring 2009) VU Jasper students begins Monday, March 16th.

Registration for students not currently attending VU Jasper Campus begins Monday, April 6th
New students will be advised by admissions personnel.

Transient students (those attending elsewhere during the school year) should have a permission letter from their advisor or registrar for the class(es) they wish to take and have all prerequisites for the class(es). Transcripts are required for proof of prerequisites. Another person may register for you, as long as all pertinent information (SS#, etc.) is provided and payment is made at the time.

Students in off-campus classes may register in person at the VU Jasper Campus Administrative Office or by mail. (See listing for courses in Lawrence, Martin, Orange, Perry, and Pike Counties)

PLACEMENT TESTING: All new students must take a placement test prior to registration. (*Transfer students may be exempt based on previous college credits. Please check with the Admissions Office.*) There is no charge for the placement testing and results are available immediately. Appointments for the testing are required.

Placement testing times are Tuesdays at 9:00 a.m. and on Thursdays at 1:30 p.m.

COST AND PAYMENT: Tuition is \$133.64 per credit hour for Indiana residents and is due at registration. Tuition rate for non-residents of Indiana is \$324.60 per credit hour. Bachelor degree upper level courses are \$154.35 per credit hour Indiana resident and \$376.40 per credit for non-resident. One-half of tuition is due May 22nd or at registration after that date. The balance is due on June 26th. Some courses have additional fees. A complete list of fees is available in the Administrative Office. **Students applying for financial aid must complete a special summer application form once they have registered for classes.**

In order to receive a REFUND because of a withdrawal, you must officially withdraw by completing the withdrawal form available in the Administrative Office. The following rates apply during the summer:
